Today we celebrate the great Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. Jesus said to his disciples: **“When the Spirit of truth comes he will lead you to the complete truth”**. The most profound truth of all is about the nature of the true God, a Trinity of Persons, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Archdiocesan Lourdes Day: The Archdiocese of St Andrews & Edinburgh Hospitalité Committee are hosting an Archdiocesan Lourdes Day at 4pm on Sunday 18 June 2017 in Edinburgh. The purpose of the day is to bring the "spirit of Lourdes" back to the Archdiocese with last year's inaugural event proving a great success. Pilgrims should gather at St Bennet's, 42 Greenhill Gardens at 4pm. A rosary procession will then make its way to the nearby St Margaret's Chapel, Gillis Centre, for Solemn Benediction. A celebratory reception for pilgrims will follow.
